

# NOTICE OF PUBLIC HEARING ON TAX INCREASE

A tax rate of \$ .133000 per \$100 valuation has been proposed by the governing body of  
Bosque County Hospital District (BCHD).

PROPOSED TAX RATE \$ .133000 per \$100  
NO-NEW-REVENUE TAX RATE \$ .127121 per \$100  
VOTER-APPROVAL TAX RATE \$ .137291 per \$100

The no-new-revenue tax rate is the tax rate for the 2021 tax year that will raise the same amount  
(current tax year)  
of property tax revenue for Bosque County Hospital District from the same properties in both  
(name of taxing unit)  
the 2020 tax year and the 2021 tax year.

The voter-approval rate is the highest tax rate that Bosque County Hospital District may adopt without holding

an election to seek voter approval of the rate.
